Once in Newport, there are numerous dog-friendly trails, parks, beaches and outdoor restaurants that will make your time here memorable.

Historic **Hotel Viking** in Newport pampers all their guests, included the four-legged variety. The hotel greets its guests with homemade doggie biscuits upon arrival and has a full menu of gourmet dog food available throughout the stay. Newport is a great city for walking with your pets, whether it is through the quaint cobblestone streets of Colonial downtown or preserved nature trails. The Aquidneck Land Trust's **Sakonnet Greenway Trail** is a great way to get outdoors and truly appreciate nature. To fulfill their mission to preserve the island's open spaces and natural character for the lasting benefit of our community, the organization is in the process of creating a 7-mile trail for the public. www.ailt.org The **Melville Ponds Recreation Area** in Portsmouth is a 130-acre park that offers hiking trails, fishing and camping. Leashed, well-behaved dogs are welcome. www.portsmouthri.com

While most beaches are open to leashed dogs from Labor Day to Memorial Day, there are some available throughout the summer months as well. In Portsmouth's **Sandy Point Beach**, dogs are allowed after 5 pm. At **Teddy's Beach** in Portsmouth, dogs are always welcome. For swimming holes in Jamestown, head to the beach at **East Ferry** and the boat ramps at **Fort Wetherill** and **Fort Getty** for a quick dip.

The beautiful state parks in the area are perfect for a day of picnicking with your family or frolicking with your dog. In Jamestown, **Fort Wetherill** has spectacular views of Newport Harbor and the East Passage of Narragansett Bay and **Beavertail State Park** offers hiking trails, saltwater fishing and beautiful views of the lighthouse. In Newport, **Fort Adams State Park** has exceptional panoramic views of the harbor and historic fort and **Brenton Point** on Ocean Drive is a favorite of families and kite flyers. Canines are welcome at Rhode Island's state parks if they are leashed, well-behaved and owners are responsible. www.riparks.com

If your dog was born to run and long walks won't do the trick, the **Newport Dog Park** is the answer. This fenced park is leash-free and provides an opportunity to exercise and socialize with other dogs. On any given sunny afternoon, your pooch will enjoy playing with a variety of new friends. The park is located on the Connell Highway Extension. "Mutt-Mitts" are provided; just remember to bring water and a ball.

To complete your Newport experience, there are several dog-friendly attractions that will teach you a little about the city's unique history. **Gansett Cruises** is known for "Harbor Tours with a Different View". Enjoy local refreshments like Del's lemonade or R.I. quahog "stuffies" and listen to the narrated tour, rich with historical facts and personal memories of the destination. Blankets and treats are provided to make your dog comfortable. (401) 787-4438 www.gansettcruises.com **Belcourt Castle** allows dogs to tour the grounds of the 60-room mansion designed by Richard Morris Hunt in 1891. Water bowls are always set out for visitors. Tours are often led by Moana, a resident "Newportonian" spaniel, dressed in her finest pearls. (401) 846-0669 www.belcourtcastle.com The world famous **Cliff Walk** is a 3.5-mile picturesque public access walk that combines the natural beauty of Newport's shoreline with the architectural history of the Gilded Age. www.cliffwalk.com

There are numerous outdoor restaurants that open their patios to dogs throughout the summer. A local favorite is the **Canfield House** in Newport, which hosts "Dog Day Afternoons" on Sundays. From 12pm-4pm, dogs are able to enjoy treats on the outdoor

patio, while owners enjoy a beverage and light meal. Other establishments with great dog-friendly patios in Newport include **O'Brien's Pub, Sardella's** and **H2O**. In Jamestown, check out places like **Tricia's Tropi-Grille, East Ferry Deli, Slice of Heaven** and **Trattoria Simpatico**. There are numerous picnic spots throughout the county, so grab a box lunch and enjoy a meal al fresco with your canine companion. If your dog is deserving of a special treat, **Frosty Freez** in Middletown has been serving great ice cream since 1956 and offers a special doggie cup (vanilla ice cream topped with a dog biscuit).

In terms of shopping, there are the obvious choices like **Petco** in Middletown, but Aquidneck Island has some great local pet stores, such as **Aquidneck Aquarium & Pet Deli** (401) 847-3361 or **Petrageous** (401) 846-3335. **Cricket and Riley**, an upscale boutique, offers everything your little "Precious" desires, from fun and frivolous to healthy and functional. In terms of events, on June 8th **Potter League's Heart and Soul Walk** for animals is not to miss! This fun family event is an annual fundraiser for the animal shelter, soon to be the only green animal shelter in the country and one of the few green public buildings in Rhode Island. Along with the 1- or 3-mile walk, there are games, demonstrations and photo contests in the picturesque grounds of Glen Park in Portsmouth.
